Willard Lapp is Killed in Mill Accident Today

Willard Lapp, 21, was instantly killed this morning when a jammed cutoff saw which he was operating at the Jack Johnston sawmill 11 miles northeast of Kalispell was forced out of position and slashed his body from his left shoulder to his abdomen.

Jamming of the saw was caused when a large timber butted the board which Lapp was sawing at the time. The big 26-inch power saw was forced out of its position and forced forward striking him first at the shoulder.

Guards covered the teeth of the saw from the top and sides, but no safety device could be placed on the lower portion of the saw. The accident, which occurred at 8:30 o'clock this morning was witnessed by the boy's brother, John, who was working at his side.

The accident victim was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Lapp, residents of the vicinity where the mill is located.

Besides parents there are seven brothers and three sisters surviving. The body is at the Waggener and Campbell funeral home and service arrangements are incomplete.

Leistner Rites to Be Held in Naval Cemetery, Arlington

Funeral services for Leon L. Leistner, 19, son of Paul Leistner of Kalispell and Mrs. Nellie Leistner of Pottlatch, Idaho, who was killed Wednesday when a navy plane crashed on a take-off at Elizabeth City, North Carolina, will be held at the Arlington naval cemetery, Washington, D. C., according to a message received Thursday by Mr. Leistner from headquarters of the Fifth naval district at Norfolk, Virginia.

Leon was one of six members killed in the crash and was rated seaman, second class. Piloting the plane at the time of the crash was Ernest A. Simpson, 28, of Seattle, aviation machinist's mate, first class.

In addition to his parents, Leistner is survived by a brother and sister, Homer and Alma, living with their mother in Idaho, and a brother, August, living here.
