**ARCHIE M'DONALD
KILLED THIS NOON
AS CAR OVERTURNS**

Was Herding Stock With Open Car When Machine Plunged Off a Dike Road and Overturned in Ditch

Archie McDonald, 22, was killed instantly near his farm home five miles east of the city about noon today when the open car in which he was attempting to drive a herd of cattle from a pasture overturned on a narrow dike road. Coroner Harry H. Campbell said his neck was broken.

McDonald left the farm house at about 11:40 a. m., and had the cattle rounded up and was driving home along the narrow roadway when the car plunged over an embankment into a ditch. Maurice Bunker, 16, who had been riding with McDonald a few minutes previously, witnessed the accident.

He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. W. D. McDonald, old-time residents of the valley, who live at the intersection of Highway No. 2 and the Montford road.

CHARLES McELROY KILLED IN ODD HUNTING ACCIDENT

Charles E. McElroy of Kalispell met death in a peculiar accident at the J. C. Ellis ranch in the Wolf Creek country yesterday afternoon while on a hunting trip.

According to report, he had shot a deer and returned to the ranch to get a horse to bring it out. He and Mr. Ellis saddled up, and were just leaving the ranch when his horse fell with him. In some unexplained manner he received a wound in the side, and died of an internal hemorrhage while Mr. Ellis was bringing him to Kalispell.

Mr. Ellis says he was riding ahead and did not see the horse fall. When he reached him Mr. McElroy said he didn't think he was badly hurt, but it was noticed that he was bleeding from his side, and he had walked but a few steps when he collapsed. They immediately started for Kalispell, but he died en route. Mrs. McElroy was with him and was at the ranch house when the accident occurred.

Mr. McElroy had been service foreman at Stoops' Garage for the past 16 years, and had many friends here.

Beside Mrs. McElroy he is survived by a brother, James McElroy of Kalispell, and two sisters, Miss Mary McElroy of Helena and Mrs. Glenn Wood of Missoula.

The body is at the Owen-Elliott mortuary. Funeral arrangements have not yet been completed.
