RONALD NOLLAR KILLED IN AUTO CRASH IN CITY

Ronald Nollar, 27, died early this morning from injuries received when his car crashed head-on into a tree at First avenue east and Eleventh street after losing control of the machine, possibly from a heart attack. He died in the ambulance while being taken to the hospital, examination disclosing that he had suffered a severe internal injury causing hemorrhage.

He was alone in the car when the accident occurred, but the crash awakened Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Opie at 1104 First avenue east. They immediately called police and a physician.

The front end of the machine was completely destroyed and parts of the car were picked up more than 75 feet away.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Henry Nollar, said that he had suffered heart attacks on several occasions. In addition to his parents he is survived by his widow and a brother, Oswald Nollar.

The body is at the Owen-Elliott funeral home. Funeral arrangements are incomplete.

CARL NYBERG DIES OF INJURIES FROM ACCIDENT ON NO. 2

Libby, Mont., Oct. 11.—(AP)—Carl Nyberg, Spokane contractor, died in a hospital here today of injuries suffered when his car went into the ditch 45 miles south of here on U. S. Highway No. 2.

Nyberg, who had been enroute from Belton to Libby, was found about 7 a. m. by a passing motorist and brought to the hospital here.

Nyberg's firm is building two stretches of highway in this area. His death was the first from auto accident injuries in Lincoln county in almost two years, and was the 146th traffic death in Montana this year.
