Whitefish Jap is Shot and Killed By Countryman

S. Togo Takahashi, 60, Japanese resident of Whitefish, was shot to death about 5 o'clock Wednesday afternoon in the hallway of the Great Northern dormitory for Japs in Whitefish and H. Kimura, 50, also a Japanese, is being held in custody at the county jail under an open charge.

County Attorney D. Gordon Roghlien said this afternoon a murder charge will probably be filed against Kimura within the next day or two.

The killing is said to have taken place shortly after the two men had completed their day's work at the roundhouse in Whitefish. Officers investigating the case said it was understood the two men had been having trouble Tuesday night and had continued their quarrel Wednesday.

Kimura, it is alleged, seized a .30 calibre automatic Luger from his room and fired its contents into Takahashi's body. Six bullets were reported to have struck Takahashi, killing him instantly.

Coroner Harry H. Campbell, one of the investigating officers, said an inquest will be held at 1 o'clock Friday afternoon. Kimura was brought here last evening shortly after the shooting by Sheriff C. A. Robinson and County Attorney D. Gordon Roghlien.

After the shooting, Kimura is said to have walked to a nearby tavern and told the proprietor, A. B. McLaughlin, "I have just shot Togo, call the police." McLaughlin then accompanied Kimura to the White-

fish police station, from where county officials were notified.

Both men, it was reported, have lived in Whitefish about 20 years. County Attorney Roghlien and Sheriff Robinson returned to Whitefish this afternoon to complete their investigation.
