David F. Owens was born Feb. 19, 1863, at Waukesha, Wisconsin. At the age of 25 he visited Demersville, where he remained for several years. He then moved to Russell, Minnesota, and entered the mercantile business there. In 1908 he disposed of his business and returned to the Flathead with his wife and family. Mrs. Owens passed away in 1933. Mr. Owens had been ill for a year and a half and passed away April 24, in Kalispell at his home on Sixth avenue east. He was 78 years of age.

Those surviving are his four sons and two daughters: Ewart of Portland, Ore., Harry of Eureka, Montana, Evan of Spokane, Robert of Hot Springs; Florence of Bigfork, and Dorothy of Glendive. Also there are nine grandchildren, and a sister, Mrs. Smithers-Clark of Spokane.
