ELLIOT BJORNEBY KILLED IN ROAD MISHAP AT CORAM

**Elderly Kalispell Jeweler Loses
Life When His Bicycle Col-
lides With Wisconsin Man's
Car**

Elliot Bjorneby, for many years a resident of Kalispell, was killed Sunday evening about 6:40 near Coram on Highway No. 2, while riding his bicycle. He left Kalispell about 2 o'clock, and probably had been to Belton or Lake McDonald.

The accident occurred when Mr. Bjorneby collided with a car driven by Raymond G. Albright, who is here from Wisconsin visiting the Jelleff family of Bigfork. According to information given Coroner Campbell by Albright, he and several members of the Jelleff family were returning from the park. About a mile east of Coram he attempted to pass Mr. Bjorneby, who was riding near the center of the highway. Mr. Albright said that just as he was passing Mr. Bjorneby swerved suddenly to the left, striking the side of his car. This was verified by other occupants of the car. Charles Wahbe, who was following, stated that he had been behind the Albright car for some distance, and that Albright

was keeping just ahead of him at 35 miles per hour. Tire marks showed that Mr. Albright was well over to the left side of the road, with the wheels on the extreme edge of the shoulder. Mr. Bjorneby fell to the pavement and suffered a cerebral concussion and fracture of the skull. He did not regain consciousness, and died just as the ambulance arrived. Medical attention was given by Dr. Kell who was called from Columbia Falls, and by Dr. A. A. Dodge, who happened to be passing, but there was nothing they could do to save his life.

Coroner Campbell states that after investigation and consultation with all witnesses to the accident, it was decided that an inquest would not be necessary.

Mr. Bjorneby came to Kalispell in 1901, and has been in the jewelry business here since that time. He was an enthusiastic bicyclist, and frequently made long runs. He is survived by Mrs. Bjorneby at the home; two sons, Narasa, who is with the American forces in Australia, Lawrence, who is with the air force, and two daughters, the Misses Tietina and Viola of San Francisco. The body is at the Waggener & Campbell funeral home, and funeral arrangements will be announced later.

Dr. Bottorf Dead; End Came Suddenly Monday Evening

The many friends of Dr. Morris W. Bottorf were greatly shocked to hear of his sudden death, which occurred at his home at 6:45 Monday evening, March 16.

Following his custom for several years past, Dr. Bottorf, accompanied by his wife, Dr. Phebe Bottorf, went to Long Beach, California last October to spend the winter. While there he was taken ill, and they returned to Kalispell March 5. He seemed considerably improved after his arrival home, and his death which resulted from a sudden heart attack, was unexpected.

Dr. Bottorf was born in Michigan in 1871, and graduated from the Hahnemann Medical College, Chicago, in 1895. In 1894 he was married to Dr. Phebe A. Anderson, and they came to Kalispell in 1896, and had practiced medicine here together since that time.

Dr. Bottorf was one of the most highly respected and esteemed men in the community, and his death will come with a sense of personal loss to many.
