### Richard DeVoe is Electrocuted at Somers Mill Today

Richard Leslie DeVoe, aged about 37, electrician for the Somers Lumber company for over 20 years, was electrocuted at Somers this morning shortly after 9 o'clock while he and two assistants were taking down a transformer from a 25-foot pole. Mr. DeVoe was doing the work at the top of the pole. He evidently touched a 2300-volt power line with his right shoulder.

The Kalispell ambulance and doctors from this city were immediately summoned and the doctors worked over him until nearly noon, but to no avail. Death appeared to be instantaneous. The deceased leaves a wife and two children by a former marriage.

The deceased was well and favorably known in Somers and Kalispell, and his many friends were greatly shocked by his sudden death.

The body is at the Waggener & Campbell Funeral home, and service arrangements are as yet incomplete.
