**FORMER LIBBY PASTOR
IS KILLED IN AIR
CRASH IN AUSTRALIA**

Mrs. Carter Hardy of Marion, has received word that First Lieutenant Albert Hart, Montana chaplain in the United States army in Australia, was killed in an airplane crash while he was flying to a new assignment.

At the time of his marriage to Miss Dorothy Bram, who is a niece

of Mrs. Hardy, Lieut. Hart was pastor of the Presbyterian church at Libby, and continued in that post until May, 1941, when he resigned to go to Columbia University to study for his doctor of philosophy degree.

The commanding officer of the Alabama unit which Rev. Hart served in Australia said that Hart was the finest chaplain he had ever known and that he would have been alive today had he not stayed behind to supervise shipments of supplies and deliver his regular Sunday sermon to those remaining in camp.

Hart, a former infantry officer, had attended the University of Wyoming and the Presbyterian Theological seminary in Chicago. His wife's family live at Sheridan, Montana.

George M. Houtz Suddenly Dies

George M. Houtz, pioneer resident, passed away suddenly Friday evening as he sat in the library of the Elks club.

When Mr. Houtz went to the club about 7 o'clock he complained of not feeling well, but evidently did not consider it serious. He went to the library and a few minutes later someone noticed that the newspaper he was reading had dropped from his hand. Upon investigation it was found that he was seriously ill, and he died within a few minutes. He had previously been in his usual health, and walked to the temple last evening.

Mr. Houtz, who was 80 years of age, was a resident of old Dentersville, where he founded the Flathead Journal. In 1891 he came to Kalispell and in the following year entered a partnership with Col. J. C. R. Moore in the publication of the Herald-Journal. After Col. Moore's death Mr. Houtz continued with the publication of the Kalispell Journal until about 25 years ago when he retired and sold his newspaper, which was continued as the Flathead Monitor. At about that time he also served a term as State Tax commissioner.

He is survived by his daughter, Mrs. Jalmer Johnson of Kalispell, with whom he has made his home in recent years, and three sons, Edwin of Missoula, E. L. of Wenatchee

and George M. Jr., of Seaside, Ore. He also has a brother, Edward Houtz, aged 80, of Dayton, Ohio.

The body is at the Waggener & Campbell Funeral home, and funeral arrangements are still incomplete.
