St. Ignatius Woman Stabbed to Death

Poison, Mont., Oct. 8—(AP)—Mrs. Mabel Josum, elderly resident of St. Ignatius, was stabbed to death early today, Sheriff J. L. Taulbee said, when she interferred with an attempted assault on her 13-year-old granddaughter by Albert Matt.

Matt was arrested at his St. Ignatius home a short time later by Deputy Sheriff Leo James and Indian Police Officer Otto Waddell and brought to the county jail here where Sheriff Taulbee said a murder charge would be filed.

The sheriff said apparently the elderly woman appeared early this morning as Matt attempted to assault her granddaughter and as she tried to intervene, he drew a hunting knife and stabbed her several times.

He then returned to his home where officers took him into custody.

INQUEST TO BE HELD MONDAY IN DEATH OF ST. IGNATIUS WOMAN

St. Ignatius, Mont., Oct. 10—(AP)—A coroner's jury will attempt to learn Monday night the cause of the death last Wednesday of Mrs. Mabel Josum, in which Albert Matt, Indian, is being held at Poison for questioning.

Mrs. Josum, elderly St. Ignatius resident, was injured fatally, Sheriff J. L. Taulbee said, when she evidently sought to protect her granddaughter, 13, from a physical attack.

Matt was taken into custody at his home here Thursday morning.
