COLUMBIA FALLS YOUTH DIES OF GUNSHOT WOUND

Robert Grigg, 15-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. George Grigg of Columbia Falls, was fatally shot Friday afternoon, about 2 o'clock, while he and another boy, Neil Wagner, 18, son of Max Wagner were walking home from town.

The boys had a .32 calibre revolver, which it is alleged they thought was empty, and in playing with it a bullet that was in the revolver was fired, striking young Griggs behind the ear. He was rushed to the Whitefish hospital where he passed away Friday evening at 7:40 o'clock.

Coroner H. H. Campbell and Sheriff Duncan McCarthy went to Whitefish and Columbia Falls this morning, and after an investigation Coroner Campbell was undecided this afternoon whether to hold an inquest or not, as there are several points that he wishes to investigate further before making his decision.

Echo Lake Man is Killed in Crash Near Ritzville

Kenneth Grilley, 39, of Echo Lake, was instantly killed at 10:30 Friday night, near Ritzville, Wash., according to the Spokane Spokesman-Review, when the pickup truck he was driving crashed into the rear of an oil truck tank trailer parked at the edge of the highway about two miles east of Ritzville.

Mrs. Gertrude Frederiek and daughter Olive of Kalispell, riding with Grilley, were severely cut and bruised and are in the hospital here. Miraculously, a 12-year-old boy, George Wolstad, Echo Lake, asleep in the rear of the pickup, was thrown clear of the wreckage and escaped without a scratch.

Potatoes and other supplies were scattered all over the highway and the pickup was all but demolished, apparently turning over and over after the crash.

Howard Lacey, Yaktma, driver of the tanker truck, reported that all lights on the truck and trailer were on as he stopped to switch his engine from one fuel oil tank to another, but that the driver of the pickup apparently failed to see them.

Grilley and his party had left Echo Lake at 1 p. m. Friday en route to Silverdale, Wash., where they were to meet Mrs. Grilley and return home.

Mr. and Mrs. Grilley have conducted the store at Echo Lake for some time, and Mr. Grilley was only recently honorably discharged from the army on account of being over age.
