OTHO HERMAN IS FATALLY INJURED IN CAR ACCIDENT

Otho Herman, aged 46 years, rancher from Niarada, was almost instantly killed at about 2:30 this morning, when the automobile in which he was riding, left the road about three miles south of Whitefish and crashed into a tree by the roadside.

George Bast of Kalspell, who was driving the car, told highway patrolmen that he was blinded by the bright headlights of an approaching automobile and was in the ditch beside the road before he knew it. From the point where the car left the highway to the tree which stopped the car it was 268 feet.

Mr. Herman had his right shoulder crushed, and the cords in his neck torn, but he lived long enough to tell Mr. Bast that he was all right, and to look after the other passengers in the car, who were Mrs. Jack McQuirk and her sister, Mrs. Lew Cooper.

The highway patrol and Coroner Harry H. Campbell were notified and went to the scene of the accident.

dent. The women passengers were taken to the Kalspell General hospital for treatment for their injuries, but this morning Mrs. Cooper was able to leave the hospital. Mrs. McQuirk suffered a cut on her head and from shock and is still in the hospital.

Mr. Bast was not seriously injured in the accident.

One whole side of the automobile was crushed and how the other passengers in the car escaped more serious injuries is a miracle.

Coroner Campbell, Sheriff Duncan McCarthy and County Attorney Marshall Murray, along with the highway patrolmen, are making an extensive examination today to get further details of the accident.

A coroner's inquest will be held early next week to inquire more fully into the cause of the accident, according to Coroner Campbell, who made the announcement this afternoon.

Mr. Herman was the son of Mr. and Mrs. John Herman, who died last year, and who were pioneers of the Big Draw country and Elmo. Of late years he has conducted the Herman cattle ranch near Niarada and leaves his widow and one son, besides his brother at Hot Springs, to mourn his death.

The Herman family was particularly well known in Kalspell, as for years they made this city their trading point, and were frequent visitors here.

Funeral arrangements are incomplete at this time and will be announced later by Waggener and Campbell funeral home, where the body of the deceased was taken.

Gunshot Death of Swan Lake Man Being Investigated

Investigation of the death of Mike Hosterman, 30, discovered near his cabin eight miles south of Swan Lake is underway by sheriff's officers of Lake county, it was learned here this afternoon. A bullet wound through the left temple and presence of a .22 calibre rifle indicates that the death may have been suicide, officers report.

The body was discovered by two 13-year-old boys Thursday and the report made to Lake county officials at Polson. The investigation will continue and an inquest may be held, it was said today.

Hosterman was taking care of the cabin for his brother, who lives in Seattle. He was crippled in one leg, the officers said. The brother has been notified and is on his way to the cabin at Swan lake. Other relatives are coming here from the east.

Officers estimate that Hosterman has been dead for approximately three days. The investigation is to be continued, Lake County officials say.

BELIEVE BOYS' DEATHS CAUSED FROM PARALYSIS

The sudden death this morning of Douglas Huggins, young son of Dr. and Mrs. H. D. Huggins, leads to the belief that his death, and that of Howard M. Hunt, nine-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Howard J. Hunt, which occurred last Friday, may have been due to infantile paralysis. He was first taken ill Sunday, and removed to the hospital for treatment. The symptoms, it is said, were similar.

Dr. J. Arthur Lamb, city health officer, this morning informed Dr. Cogswell of the State Board of Health of the situation, and Dr. B. K. Kilbourne, state epidemiologist, is being sent here to investigate. Upon his arrival he will meet with the local health authorities and members of the school board to decide what measures to take to prevent the spread of the disease.

Dr. Lamb says it is believed that it may be what is known as the "Bulbar" type of paralysis, in which the muscles of the throat become paralyzed.

Dr. Lamb says he was informed by Dr. Cogswell that only one case of infantile paralysis has been reported in the state, and that was from Eozeman. He also says that where there is a large family, it is very rare for more than one member to contract the disease.

Dr. Lamb suggests that people avoid public gatherings, and keep their health up to normal as much as possible. He says:

"We do not know whether we will have any more cases as there may have been a few more exposures from these cases, but they are being watched as far as known, and asked to stay away from public gatherings. The disease seems to be somewhat more prevalent this year in the United States than in other years."

A. E. Ilgen, chairman of the school board, this morning authorized a deferment of the opening of school for one week, subject to the concurrence of the board, and the report of Dr. Kilbourne.

An iron lung for the treatment of Douglas Huggins was sent from Missouri this morning, but did not arrive until after his death.
