The message, which is from the Adjutant General, says:

"The Secretary of War desires me to express his deep regret that your son, Private Leo R. Johnson, was killed in action in defense of his country in the Southwest Pacific area on January 16. Letter follows."

Private Johnson was a member of Company F, Montana National Guard, and left here with the company when it went to Camp Murray, Washington. He went to Australia in March, 1942.
