### Chas. Kester Found Dead in Cabin at Col. Falls Today

Charles John Kester, was found dead in his cabin one mile west of Columbia Falls this morning by Constable George Grigg, who had gone there to investigate after residents reported they had not seen him for about two months. Mr. Grigg then notified Flathead County Coroner Harry Campbell and sheriff's officers who went to the scene.

It is believed that death resulted from natural causes, probably starvation, Mr. Campbell said. The man, who is 58, was on his bed on the floor with only his trousers on. The door was hooked shut from the inside. No food was found in the shack and the man appeared to be very thin. The inside of the cabin was very much smoked and so was the body of the man. It was said that it had been his custom to build a fire on the dirt floor of the cabin.

Mr. Campbell said that Mr. Kester had been dead for some time but it was difficult to set a specific date. Funeral arrangements will be made at once. Mr. Kester had lived in Columbia Falls for a number of years and was a single man.
