**Sgt. Ernest Maier  
Killed in Action**

August Maier of Columbia Falls, RFD 1, has received a telegram informing him that his son, Sergeant Ernest A. Maier, was killed in action in the North African area September 13.

The telegram is from Adjutant General Ullo, and says:

"The Secretary of War desires that I tender his deepest sympathy to you in the loss of your son, Sergeant Ernest A. Maier. A report received states that he was killed in action Sept. 13 in the North Africa area. Letter follows."

Mr. Maier says that his son enlisted in February, 1942. He spent several months in training in Texas, California and Louisiana, and went overseas last December. He was in a bomber group in the air service. The family had not heard from him for two months, and felt that something was wrong.

**JOHN McKNIGHT, EARLY DAY LOGGER, FOUND DEAD IN HIS CABIN**

John McKnight, aged 78 years, an old-time logger, who had resided in the Flathead for the past 50 years, was found dead in his cabin in Second avenue west by his landlord, Hugh Thibodeau, Saturday. County Coroner Harry Campbell, who was called to view the body stated that McKnight had died of a cerebral embolism, and had been dead for a week or more.

McKnight had evidently bent over and tried to fix the fire in the stove when death struck as he was found in that position. Everything in the cabin had been frozen and thawed during the time his body was undiscovered. He was single and occupied the cabin by himself.

The deceased had been employed by Henry Good and Tom Gardner in the woods a number of years ago as a teamster and powder-man. He was one of the drivers of the teams that hauled the largest sled-load of logs ever brought out of the woods in this part of the state. He had no known relatives in Montana.

# Two Killed, Eight Critically Injured In Collision Of Railroad Speeders At Ural

**BOGEASAR ATARIAN OF WHITEFISH AND ANTON MOEN OF MINNEAPOLIS ARE VICTIMS OF CRASH OCCURRING TUESDAY EVENING**

Libby, Nov. 17—(AP)—Anton Moen, 54, died at noon today, the second victim of a collision between two speeders of the Great Northern Railway on the track 35 miles northeast of Libby at about 8 o'clock last evening. The first victim was Bogeasar Atarian, 50, of Whitefish, who died before reaching the Libby hospital last night. Moen's home was in Minneapolis.

The collision involved 15 men who made up two work crews assigned to repair the track after the derailment of a freight car near Ural at noon yesterday. One car was returning from work while the other was on its way to Ural. Eight of the men were

critically injured and are at the Libby hospital. The remaining five who suffered cuts and bruises are at the Libby hotel.

The seriously injured include Austen Easroet, 44, of Ural; Rufina Hernagemo, 39, address unknown; Jack McCure, 25, of Ural; Kay Hajafhi, 48, no address; Tom Wilson, 61, no address; Casper Schutman, 31, no address; Nick Kembitch of Ural, and Austen Agnamooini, 62, of Ural.

The five who are having minor injuries cared for at the hotel are John Rogga of Milwaukee, Rodney Harrington of St. Paul, Fred Olson and E. W. Johnston of Whitefish and Ed Olson of Bonners Ferry, Idaho.
