MRS. W. N. NOFFSINGER PASSES AWAY SUDDENLY

Mrs. W. N. Noffsinger, one of the pioneer residents of Kalispell, passed away peacefully at her home shortly after 4 o'clock this morning, after a recent brief illness.

Mrs. Noffsinger had been in ill health for the past four years, but was up and about the house until Tuesday evening, when she suffered a stroke, and never regained consciousness.

She came here with her husband, the late W. N. Noffsinger from Pomeroy, Washington 52 years ago, when Mr. Noffsinger came to Kalispell to practice law, and until recent years has always taken an active part in community affairs. She was a member of Christ Episcopal church since its organization, and was for many years president of the Episcopal Guild.

She is survived by her son and daughter-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. George Noffsinger of Babb, her daughter, Mrs. Leila Dieringer of Kalispell, and several grandchildren. Mr. and Mrs. Noffsinger were notified by phone when she was first taken ill, and arrived here yesterday.

The funeral will be Monday, April 26, but the hour has not yet been definitely decided on. Rev. Chas. Wilson, of Helena, former pastor of Christ church will conduct the service.

OSCAR NORD IS FOUND DEAD IN CABIN AT LOWER BROWN MEADOW

Sheriff Duncan McCarthy and Deputy Sheriff Royal Hopkins left at 3 o'clock this afternoon for the lower Brown's Meadow on the Flathead Mine road to bring in the body of Oscar Nord who was found dead in the cabin in which he lived alone. The death was reported to the sheriff's office by Ed Holloran who is working in the Brown's Meadow area. No particulars were available as to the cause of death.

DEATH OF OSCAR NORD DUE TO HEART AILMENT

Oscar Nord passed away at his cabin 10 miles southwest of Kila early Tuesday morning at the age of 70 years. He lived alone and the body was discovered by Ed Holloran, who snowshoed in to the cabin to see Mr. Nord and found him dead in bed. Death was due to a heart ailment, according to Coroner Harry Campbell who, with Mr. Holloran and Sheriff McCarthy went in and brought the body out.

Mr. Nord was a bachelor and had lived in that section for about 35 years. Relatives in Connecticut have been notified and service arrangements will be announced later by the Waggener and Campbell Funeral home.

Bigfork Man is Killed in Bomber Crash at Ephrata

Ephrata, Wash., May 18—(AP)—Ten army fliers—five officers and five enlisted men—were killed early Monday in a ground collision between two four-engined bombers at the Ephrata army air base. Five others escaped.

The base, in a report released today, said one of the bombers collided with a sister ship while preparing to take off on a routine night flying mission. The second plane burst into flames.

Lieut. Frederiek M. Pape, air base public relations officer, said the dead were:

First Lieut. Lloyd H. Nygard, Bigfork, Mont.; Second Lieuts. Donald Wright, Seattle; Leland W. Crumbaugh, Warrensburg, Mo.; Billy J. Evans, El Reno, Okla., and Daniel H. Stone, Jr., Brooklyn, N. Y.; Staff Sgt. Ray Cook, Alma, Okla.; Sgts. George Sevkarian, Chelsea, Mass., and Kenneth L. Johnson, Searsboro, Iowa; Pfc. Mark D. Glynn, Tampa, Fla., and Pfc. Edward F. Pych, Alton, N. Y.

Word was received here yesterday that Lloyd H. Nygard, of the east lake shore, was one of the men who were killed in the plane crash Sunday at the Army Air Base in Ephrata, Washington. The body is being shipped to Kalispell and funeral arrangements will be announced later by the Elliot Mortuary.

The body of Lieut. Lloyd Nygard, who was killed in an airplane crash at Ephrata, Wash., did not arrive in Kalispell in time to hold the funeral today as announced. The funeral will be held tomorrow (Friday) at the Elliot mortuary at 2 o'clock.

The community was grieved to learn of the death of Lieut. Lloyd Nygard in a plane crash. Lieut. Nygard had received his aviation training in Canada but had transferred to U.S.A. when this country went into the war. He had been assigned as instructor to the field at Ephrata. His parental home is now at Woods Bay.
