**FORMER KALISPELL
MAN DIES, SEATTLE**

Fred Rankin, former Kalispell resident, was found by Seattle officers Wednesday, July 14, slashed on the throat and legs, and later died at the Harbor View hospital in that city. His body was sent to a sister at Dubuque, Iowa, for interment.

Rankin, 45, had a brilliant World War I record, which included action in five major battles, being twice wounded and winning the Order of the Purple Heart, a Purple Heart ribbon and the Maple Leaf and Oak Leaf Cluster.

Officers learned that Rankin had been suffering ill health, possibly from the effects of his war wounds and that he had been drinking prior to his death.

Rankin was a dish-washer and night clerk at the National hotel in Kalispell from 1938 to 1941, and was known to a number of people in this city.

Lieut. Kenneth Rongstad Is Killed In Action In Europe

Parents of Lieutenant Kenneth B. Rongstad were advised today that he had been killed in action, November 19, in the European area. Word came to Mr. and Mrs. Rongstad from the adjutant general and the telegram said a letter would follow.

First pilot on a Flying Fortress, Lieutenant Rongstad, 21, had been in the European theater for two months. About a month ago, he was rescued from the North Sea after having been downed and he and seven other men were on a raft for several hours. He recuperated for a few days in the hospital after that experience.

Born in Kalispell, the young flier attended local schools and graduated from Flathead county high school in 1940. He was especially interested in photography and worked at the Photo Art Shop before enlisting soon after Pearl Harbor.

He received his training at Kelly Field, Texas.
