Whitefish Youth Dies as Result Of Gun Accident

Patrick Shannon, aged 12, was shot Sunday afternoon at 5 o'clock cast of Whitefish, and died within a few minutes.

According to Coroner Harry H. Campbell and Sheriff Duncan Mc-Carthy, who investigated, the lad left home shortly after noon with two other boys, Ralph McDonald 12, and Jim Quenemoen, 11. All were carrying .22 callbre rifles, and went to the vicinity of the stockyards to spend the afternoon shoot-They were returning across a field cast of the R. D. Fredericks home, with the Shannon boy ahead, and the other two following. They were joking about being cops and robbers, when the Quenemoen boy raised his gun. The safety was brushed off by his clothing and the gun discharged. Investigation showed that the safety was very loose and moved freely either way. The unfortunate boy took a step and fell. One of the other boys rushed to the Frederick residence and Mr. Frederick called Dr. Taylor, but the boy lived only a few minutes.

Pat was the son of Mrs. Rose P. Carskaddon, and all three boys lived on West Second street in Whitefish. The body is at the Campbell Funeral home in Whitefish.

DEMERSVILLE LADS DROWN WHEN ICE ON RIVER BREAKS

Robert Parker and Donald Smith Victims of Tragic Accident—Had Been Coasting From River Bank Onto Ice

A tragedy on the Flathead river took the lives of two Demersville youths Sunday afternoon shortly after 3 o'clock. Robert Parker, age 12 years, and Donahl Wayne Smith, age 14 years, were coasting on the west bank of the Flathead river near the Parker home at Poy's Bend, sliding out onto the snow-covered lee. Smith got onto this ice and broke through and Parker sot a pole and attempted to get out to help him but also went through the ice.

The accident was witnessed by Stuart and Everett Swenson and another fisherman from the opposite bank and they were powerless to help as they had no boat or other means of crossing the open channel between.

Sheriff McCarthy and his force recovered the body of Parker just before dark last night and the Smith lad's body was recovered Monday morning. There was 50 feet of water where the accident occurred.

Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd Parker are the parents of Robert and the Smith boy was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Archie L. Smith of Demersville.
