TWO-YEAR-OLD TOT KILLED BY TRUCK NEAR LUPFER WED.

Gladys Patsy-Louise Anderson, two-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Lester Anderson, was run over and killed by her father's wood truck in the forest near Lupfer Wednesday afternoon.

Mr. and Mrs. Anderson and two children, aged five and two, were in the woods getting firewood at the time of the tragic accident. The road was rough and Mrs. Anderson and children got out and walked for a short distance. A snag was across the road and Mrs. Anderson left the youngsters behind the machine while she ran ahead to remove the barrier. While Mrs. Anderson was working with the snag the children had moved up beside the truck unnoticed and when Mr. Anderson started the older child screamed and Mrs. Anderson motioned to her husband to back up.

Gladys evidently was near the rear wheel and slipped and fell under it when the machine started ahead. The truck did not pass over her but went far enough to crush her head before stopping. The family has been living at Lupfer, 15 miles northwest of Whitefish, all summer but were preparing to move to near Whitefish.

They have lived in that area nearly a year.

Coroner Campbell and Sheriff McCarthy investigated the accident.
