The letter follows:

"Kingman Army Air Field
Kingman, Arizona.
"March 5, 1944

"Dear Mrs. Bailey:

"I am writing these few lines to send you my deepest feelings of sympathy during your bereavement. Yesterday a letter came from Brother Paul and he wrote me the sad news of Mr. Bailey's passing. He said that it was only a few days ago he had run an errand for him and I know he feels the loss of his good friend very keenly. I feel the same way. We knew Henry was not well for some time but still I had hoped to visit you both again this spring. (I have hopes of getting a leave before too long.) Your dear husband was surely a good neighbor and true friend to us all. I'll always remember the fishing trips we were on together—he taught me a lot about fishing and the out-doors and gave me a love for it. Henry helped a lot of us kids in the neighborhood 'grow up' and will be greatly missed by a host of friends. He was like a father to us.

"But I guess it is just a matter of time before all of us go from this world. We may go any time and it is always for the best. May the good Lord comfort you in your sorrow, Mrs. Bailey, and I hope that this note finds you in good health.
