**LIEUT JACK CRAVEN
KILLED IN ENGLAND
IN AERIAL COLLISION**
Mrs. Kathleen Craven has been advised by the War Department that her husband, Second Lt. Jack L. Craven, was killed on July 28, 1944, at Slanford, England, in an airplane collision. The telegram stated that a letter would follow.
Lt. Craven would have been 23 years old August 7. He enlisted in the Air Corps in May, 1942, and was not called until March, 1943. He was commissioned a second lieutenant May 23, 1944.
He was married to the former Kathleen Freer of 114 Fourth avenue east, and is survived by his wife and small son, Jackie Lee, and by his mother, Mrs. Lucile Craven, and two sisters, Margaret and Ethel. A brother, S/Sgt. Thomas Craven, was killed in the Pacific, January 1, 1944.

SGT. CRAVEN DIES OF WOUNDS RECEIVED AT BOUGAINVILLE ISLAND

Staff Sergeant Thomas G. Craven, formerly of Somers, died January 1 as the result of wounds received at Bougainville, it has been learned here from a message sent by the War Department. He would have been 27 years old this month. Craven was a radio operator on a B-24 Liberator bomber.

He had been in the service for a year and a half, receiving his radio training at Chicago and airplane training in Utah and Arizona. He was married to Rhea Marie Casey of 161 First avenue east north in May, 1941. She is the daughter of A. J. Casey.

Also surviving are his mother, Mrs. Lucille Craven, a brother, Jack, who is in the air corps, and two sisters, Margaret and Ethel.

HAROLD G. CUMMINS

Harold G. Cummins, Sr., passed away in Tacoma, Wash., March 10, 1944. Services were held from the Episcopal church in Tacoma where he had served as vestryman. Interment was in the New Tacoma cemetery with an American Legion post from Tacoma rendering full military honors. Mr. Cummins worked as representative for the Flathead Motor Sales company in Whitefish for a number of years.
