**WHITEFISH MAN DIES  
OF WOUNDS FROM  
BATTLE ACTION, ITALY**

Glen F. Good, 24, died March 4 as the result of wounds received February 28 in the Italian campaign. The son of W. L. Good of Whitefish, he had spent most of his life in the Grandview district, later moving to Whitefish. The late W. S. Beller was his grandfather.  
Good is one of the first servicemen in the Whitefish area who has given his life in World War II. The information was received by his father from the War department. He had enlisted in the service three years ago.

He was one of the most successful logging contractors in this section, and operated one of the finest farms in Flathead county, where he has lived in recent months. He was also chairman of the State Highway commission a number of years ago.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Alice Good, and by two sons, Mark Good of Billings, and Lt. Henry K. Good of the Army Air Force, now stationed at Gardiner Field, California.

George H. Grubb, well known local attorney, passed away at his home at 419 Fourth avenue east last evening after a brief illness. Mr. Grubb is one of the early pioneers of the Flathead, having come to Demers-

Memorial services for the late George H. Grubb, pioneer Flathead lawyer, were conducted in the Eleventh Judicial District court here Friday. His partner, Forrest Rockwood, read the memorial prepared by J. E. Rockwood, Hans Walchli and E. B. Foot, legal colleagues of Mr. Grubb.

Mr. Grubb passed away January 17, 1944 at the age of 82. His professional honors were many. He incorporated the City of KallsPELL as its first city attorney, was among the first of the county attorneys for Flathead, served in the state legislature and was the first president of the Flathead County Bar association.

Members of the profession extended profound sympathy to his widow, Mrs. George H. Grubb, and resolved that a copy of the memorial be sent to her.
