Sgt. Kirkpatrick Is Listed As Dead

Mr. and Mrs. Warren C. Kirkpatrick have received information from the war department that no further information has been received regarding their son, Staff Sergeant Ward W. Kirkpatrick, who was reported missing in action May 15, 1943.

The information is contained in a letter from Major General Ulio, who says:

"Dear Mr. and Mrs. Kirkpatrick: "Since your son, Staff Sergeant Ward W. Kirkpatrick of the Army Air corps was reported missing in action May 15, 1943, the war department has entertained the hope that he survived, and that information would be revealed dispelling the uncertainty surrounding his disappearance. However, as in many eases, the conditions of warfare deny us such information. The record concerning your son shows that he was a crew member aboard an aircraft which disappeared over the North Sea, while on a hombing mission to Wilhelmshaven, Germany.

"Full, consideration has recently been given to all available information bearing on the absence of your son, including all records, reports and circumstances. These have been carefully reviewed and considered. In view of the fact that 12 months have now expired without receipt of evidence to support a continued presumption of survival, the war denartment must terminate such absence by a meaumptive finding of death. Accordingly an official finding of death has been recorded.

"I regret the necessity for this message, but trust that the ending of a long period of uncertainty may give at least some small measure of consolation.

"I hope you may find sustaining comfort in the thought that the uncertainty with which war has surrounded the absence of your son has enhanced the honor of his service to his country and of his surrifice."

Sergeant Kirkpatrick enlisted in the Army Air corns a few days after the Japanese attack on Pearl Harhor.
