**FRANK MASTERTSON**

Frank Mastertson, an early resident of northwest Montana, died Thursday morning. He was 41 years of age. He formerly engaged in logging operations in the Flathead.

Mr. Mastertson had the distinction of making the first filing on the Flathead Indian reservation when it was opened to settlement in 1910. He arranged for relays of riders from Proctor to Somers, and arrived in Kalispell hours before the opening of the land office, and long before the arrival of any other entrymen. His filing was in the Dayton valley, where he made his home for many years. He was also in charge of the last round-up of the buffalo herd on the Pablo ranch on the reservation.

When the family first arrived in the Flathead valley the mother and children made their home for the first winter in a tent near the site of the Flathead Mine in the Hog Heaven section. They were among the early settlers, and houses were few and far between at that time.

Frank Mastertson was among the few remaining early settlers in this section, and will be missed by those who knew him.

His body was recovered about two hours later by police and firemen.
