**Lt. Warren Putman
Killed In Action**

Mr. and Mrs. Glenn Putman of R.F.D. 2 Kalispell, were advised by the War Department Monday that their son, Lieut. Warren Putman, previously reported as missing, was killed in action December 31, 1943.

The War Department received this news through the International Red Cross from Germany.

Mr. and Mrs. Putman first learned that their son was missing after a fight over enemy territory on January 14 of this year. No details were received at that time and additional information was lacking in Monday's wire.

Lieutenant Putman was born and reared here and attended schools in the Flathead. He was with the Eighth U. S. Air Force as pilot of a Flying Fortress and had been in England since November 10, 1943. He enlisted in the army air corps Dec. 6, 1941, and graduated from Ellington Field, Texas.
