TWO CORAM MEN KILLED IN GRADE CROSSING MISHAP

Two Coram residents met death Friday as a result of a railroad crossing accident which occurred about three-quarters of a mile east of Coram. Richard Ramont, 63, and J. H. Neiswender, 61, were riding in the truck which was hit by Section No. 2 of the westbound Empire Builder about 3:20 o'clock Friday afternoon.

Mr. Ramont died almost instantly, but Mr. Neiswender lived for a few hours, passing away about 7 o'clock at the Whitefish hospital, where he had been taken.

Both men are survived by their widows.

C. E. RANDELS

Word has been received here of the death of Charles E. Randels at Tucson, Arizona, following a year's illness.

Mr. Randels was a civil engineer in the National Park service, and was transferred from Lassen National Park to Glacier in 1926 and served under Superintendents C. E. Krabel, J. Ross Eakin and E. T. Scoyen. In 1934 he was transferred to Teton National Park, Wyoming, where he served with the same success as on other assignments.

Mr. Randels was a native of Ohio and a homesteader on the Flathead Indian reservation, where he met and married Henrietta Geiger, who survives him at Tucson.

One of the outstanding achievements of Mr. Randels while in Glacier National Park was to suggest and later build the saddle horse tunnel through Ptarmigan Wall, thereby eliminating the longer and steeper trail over Red Gap. He was employed in the Omaha regional office of the park service when he became ill.
