Mr. Sand was 28 years of age and leaves his wife and four children.

LLOYD SCHOENING OF SOMERS KILLED IN AUTO ACCIDENT

Lloyd Schoening, 15-year-old Somers youth, was killed about 10 o'clock Tuesday night when the auto in which he was riding with three other companions left the road at the foot of the hill on Highway No. 93 just south of Lakeside.

Occupants of the car were Eddie Bull, 13, the driver, who suffered a broken leg; Charles Bull, who sustained severe cuts about the face, Miss Imogene Meldrum, 17, who was uninjured, and young Schoening.

According to officers, the auto was going south and left the road at a curve and plunged into the timber where it crashed into three trees.

Lloyd was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Otto Schoening of Somers.

After the accident occurred Miss Meldrum went to the highway and flagged the first passing car which brought the injured boys to the hospital and notified officers.

Coroner Harry Campbell, who investigated the wreck with Sheriff Duncan McCarthy and highway patrolmen, was of the opinion Schoening died almost instantly as he suffered a crushed skull. The car was nearly demolished and the cause of the mishap has not yet been determined.
