# HUGH THIBODEAU BURNED TO DEATH IN ODD ACCIDENT

Hugh Thibodeau, a resident here from the early days, met a strange and terible death Thursday evening, when his clothing took fire from a blow torch he was using to repair a drain pipe, and he burned to death on the roof of the building he owned and occupied at 315 Second avenue west.

Neighbors in the vicinity first noticed a light in his apartment, but saw no one about the place, and called the police to investigate. It was remembered that he had been working on the roof earlier in the day, and officers climbed a ladder, and found the body lying on the roof. Coroner Campbell was called and with the police unrayeled the tragic story.

He had taken his tools to the roof and gone down through a trap door to a small attic space, evidently to repair a drain pipe. In some manner his coat caught on fire from a blow torch he was using. He had taken off the coat and put out the fire, but his other clothing was evidently ablaze, and he crawled out (Continued on page 3)

book and other belongings were

watch had stopped at 7:30, which
was probably the hour when he methis death.

Thibodean was a bachelor, and lived alone in his building. He was an electrician by trade, had a very good business here in the early days, and owned considerable property on the west side from which he derived an income from rentals. Those who knew him best say he came here from Ottawa, and that he was about 85 years old.

One of his most prized possessions was an old Mitchell car which is said to have been one of the first automobiles in Kallspell.

The early day models didn't generally work very well, but "Th", as he was known to his friends, could always make his go, and often drove it in parades during celebrations. He owned the old carlo the day of his death, and it is still in running condition.

He is survived by a cousin, Mrs. 4da Chasse, of Kalispell, and a brother, J. R. Thibodeau of Scattle, who has been notified by Coroner (Campbell.

The body is at the Waggener & Campbell Funeral home, and Taneral arrangements are incomplete, pending word from the brother.
