Body of Charles Young Discovered In River Tuesday

Discovery of the body of Charles Thomas Young, 73, in a pool 20 feet deep downstream from the Steel bridge on Flathead river late Tuesday afternoon ended the search which started Monday afternoon for the missing fisherman. Ben Burshia and C. Jensen, both of Kalispell, who were fishing in that vicinity, saw a fishing basket in the water, investigated and found the body. They then informed authorities who brought it in a boat to the highway.

As there was no direct indication of drowning, it is believed that he was overcome by a heart attack. Flathead County Coroner Harry H. Campbell said today. His watch had stopped at 2:30. The supposition is that he completed fishing from a bar in the river and was wading to the mainland when he was stricken.

The body was swept into a deep pool where it was discovered.

Mr. Young had first come to Kalispell in 1906 but moved away and returned a year and a half ago. His widow and a daughter, Ruby Young, reside here.

Masonic services will be conducted Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Waggener & Campbell chapel followed by interment in the C. E. Conrad Memorial cemetery.

WILLIAM YUNCK

William Yunck died at Cut Bank Tuesday, according to word received by local friends. A prominent oil man, Mr. Yunck had been well known here and his parents had made their home in this community. Mr. Yunck was about 66 years old at the time of his death. He was part owner of the Baldwin & Yunck property in Kalispell. He is survived by his widow and sons.

Funeral services will be held at Cut Bank and interment will take place in the C. E. Conrad Memorial cemetery Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Graveside services will be conducted by Rev.
