ISABEL D. GREIG

Isabel (Dunsire) Greig was born at Buckhaven, Fifeshire, Scotland on March 10, 1861.

She grew to young womanhood in the place of her birth and on February 22, 1881, at Buckhaven, she was united in marriage to David Greig, whose birthplace was but three miles from that of his bride, and who had been a schoolmate and playmate through childhood and adolescence.

Mr. Greig came to America in 1882 arriving in the Flathead in November of that year, and Mrs. Greig, with their baby daughter followed in the spring of 1884, coming directly to St. Ignatius where her husband was engaged in the erection of buildings for the Catholic Mission.

They remained at St. Ignatius for nine months and then journeyed to the ranch which Mr. Greig had secured just southwest of Kalispell, where they have lived since that time, a total of over 60 years. Death occurred January 17, 1945, and she had reached the age of 83 years.

Near surviving relatives, besides her husband, David Greig, are a daughter, Mrs. C. J. McAllister of Helena, a brother, John Dunsire, and a sister, Mrs. Tom Grieg, both living in Scotland, and another brother, Andrew Dunsire, who is living in Kalispell.

Mrs. Greig united with the Presbyterian church under the ministry of the Rev. Mr. Fisher, and later united with the Baptist church under the ministry of the Rev. Mr. Pauls. She sang in the first church choir in the Flathead Valley, and for several years sang in the choir of the Epworth Methodist church.
