

ERLING ISAKSON

Erling Isakson was born July 18, 1897, at Skien, Norway. He moved with his parents to the United States in 1910 and settled with the family near Bigfork, Montana. He attended school at Swan River. He enlisted in Company "F" of Kalispell 163rd U. S. Infantry when war was declared on April 6, 1916. He left Kalispell with this company and later transferred to Company "K" of the 15th Infantry, 1st division, and saw action at Cantigny and Soissons, France, and was wounded at Soissons on July 18, 1918. He was mustered out of the service at El Paso, Texas, August 10, 1920. He was married at Kalispell, Montana, December 26, 1920, to Bessie Schutt of Kalispell. To this union three children were born, Orville, now serving with the armed forces in Italy, and Grace Johnson, and John Isakson of Kalispell.

Erling Isakson died at Kalispell February 2, 1945, at the age of 47 years. He was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Disabled American Veterans and the Fraternal Order of Eagles.

He leaves to mourn his loss, besides his wife and children, his mother, Karoline Isakson, two brothers, Iver Isakson of Kalispell and Haakon Isakson of Bigfork, Montana. Also two sisters, Lillie Mosher of Portland, Ores., and Manie Williams of Caldwell, Idaho, besides other relatives and many friends.
