James Bernard Tivnan was born December 27, 1889, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and at an early age moved to New York City, where he lived for many years.

Mr. Tivnan was a veteran of World War I and in 1929 he first visited Kalispell and liked the Flathead valley so much that he returned in May, 1937, remaining here until September, 1938. In 1941 he returned again to the Flathead to make Kalispell his home and at the time of his passing, was employed by the J. C. Penney Co., for whom he had worked for the past 20 months. Mr. Tivnan passed away on the evening of December 31, 1945, at the age of 56 years and is survived by two brothers: Eugene and Thomas Tivnan of New York City.

#### Obituary

Knudt Torgerson was born in Telemarken, Norway, Sept. 29, 1866 and came to this country with his parents in 1881. They settled in Fillmore county, Minn., and later moved to Grant county. Mr. Torgerson was married in 1899 to Miss Ella Austinson and 10 years later they homesteaded at Fillmore, North Dakota. They made their home there until a year ago when they came to Kallispell.

Mr. Torgerson passed away in Kallispell September 4, 1945, at the age of 74 years.

He is survived by his widow, Ella Torgerson, at home; and eight children, Charles at Leeds, North Dakota; Mrs. Silas Olson, Norcross, Minn.; Sigurd at McVille, North Dakota; Anna, Bertina, Henry and Melvin and Kenneth of all Kallispell. Two sons, Oscar and Theodore, preceded him in death.
