Rexford Man Dies In Sunday Morning Highway Accident

Morse Anderson, 55, was killed early Sunday morning in a automobile accident between Rexford and Eureka. A state highway patrolman who investigated the tragedy stated that Mr. Anderson's car hit a concrete abutment on the Tobacco river bridge. His watch stopped at 2:40 a. m., and it is assumed that he died almost instantly.

Mr. Anderson was an operator for the railroad and had left Rexford shortly after midnight. When the crash occurred, he was thrown out of his car. Two men who were hiking across the fields to their homes, heard the crash, turned and saw the car was burning. They hurried to the scene and pulled Mr. Anderson about 40 feet from the car. His trousers were on fire at that time.
