Mrs. G. E. Barnum Killed in Wreck

Mrs. G. E. Barnum was killed in an automobile accident Monday evening near Pierre, South Dakota and Mr. Barnum is in the hospital there. The Barnums had lived at Bozeman for about 12 years but were old-time residents of the Flathead making their farm home east of the Flathead river. They visited in Kalspell about two weeks ago and were on their way to Battle Creek, Michigan to visit a son. Mrs. Barnum was sleeping in the back seat of the car and Mr. Barnum was driving. The accident occurred at night when they met a truck and in turning out the car got on a soft shoulder of the road and overturned.

Mrs. Barnum was 74 years of age and had not been in good health for some time.

There are five children: Mrs. Ethan Ford of Sidney, Mont.; Donald Barnum of Belton and Dick Barnum of Kalspell, who left by car today; Harold Barnum of Battle Creek, Mich. who is flying to Pierre, and Frank Barnum, who lives near Bozeman, and arrived in Pierre this morning.

Mr. Barnum's condition is considered favorable unless a former heart condition causes trouble.

Whitefish Rail Brakeman Killed At Summit Sunday

Claire Blush, 52, of Whitefish, was killed Sunday afternoon, about 3 o'clock when struck by a snow dozer at Summit on the Great Northern railroad, according to Coroner Harry Campbell, who investigated.

Mr. Blush, who was a brakeman for the Great Northern, had just arrived at Summit with an east-bound freight train and was releasing the air from the brakes before the train went on and it is believed he stepped back from the train, causing him to be hit by the wing blade of the snow dozer which was working on an adjacent track.

There were no witnesses to the accident and it was not known until the body was found. He suffered injuries to the head, chest and left arm and it is believed he may have been killed instantly.

He is survived by his wife, Erma, of Whitefish, and one son who is now in the army.

The body is at the Catron Funeral home in Whitefish and services will be announced.
