Charles I. Carr died at a hospital in Missoula early Saturday morning, according to word received here. He had gone to Missoula the latter part of January for hospitalization and fell there, fracturing a leg.

Mr. Carr was born March 2, 1860 in Tazewell county, Ill. He had farmed in Central Illinois and in 1883 was married to Emma Bowles. The family moved to the Flathead valley in 1918 where Mr. Carr had farmed until his retirement 10 years ago. He had worked for the Flathead Commercial company until three weeks ago. Mr. Carr had been interested in civic affairs and was a member of the Christian church.

The body will lie in state at the Christian church in Kalispell Tuesday from 11 a. m. until 2 p. m., when funeral services will be conducted by the Rev. D. E. Allen. Lucey's Funeral home of Missoula is in charge of arrangements.

Survivors are the widow, Emma L. Carr of Kalispell; four sons, R. W. Carr, Creston; Clyde I. Carr, Kalispell; J. Burt Carr, Seattle, and Lyle Carr, Missoula; one daughter, Mrs. Bernice Harkelroth, Kalispell, and one sister, Mrs. C. P. Huff, Payette, Idaho.

## Marion Man Dies In Truck Crash Near Kila Sunday

William T. Carver, 26, of Marion, formerly of the Great Falls vicinity, was instantly killed, and his two brothers, Loman and Victor are in the Kalispell General hospital with injuries due to an accident when the truck in which they were coming to Kalispell ran off highway No. 2 about nine miles west of Kalispell, near Kila, late Sunday afternoon.

William Carver received a badly crushed chest and shoulder and was dead when taken from beneath the overturned truck. Victor suffered a severe leg injury and cuts about the head and face and Loman is suffering from shock.

Sheriff Duncan McCarthy, who was called to the scene of the accident, said the army truck in which the young men were riding, apparently got out of control, ran off the highway, striking a stump and overturning, completely demolishing the cab.

Passersby stopped to assist the men and the city ambulance was called to bring Loman and Victory to the hospital. The young men had been employed by Pete Marsh who is in the lumber business at Marion and was the owner of the truck.

The father and brother of the injured men were notified of the accident and arrived here from Great Falls Monday morning. The sheriff's office, highway patrol and Coroner Harry Campbell, are continuing an investigation of the accident.

It was reported by hospital attendants this noon that the conditions of Victor and Loman Carver are improved.
