George Edwards, age about 55 years, was found dead Friday morning from a self-inflicted gunshot wound from a hunting rifle in the woods a short distance back of his farm home.  
Coroner Harry H. Campbell investigated and found the man had left a note to his wife at the farm home five miles southeast of Columbia Falls Thursday evening. He had been despondent over his health for some time. Mr. Edwards was a veteran of World War I and had lived in the Bad Rock community over 40 years. He leaves his wife, Theresa, and a son James.
