### Local Man Killed In Bomber Crash In Nebraska Mon.

Colorado Springs, Colo., Aug. 27.—(AP)—An army board today investigated the crash of a B-25 bomber from Peterson Field three miles north of McCook, Nebr., in which the crew of three men was killed instantly.

The Peterson Field public relations office said the plane was on a routine administrative flight.

Col. Lee B. Coate, commanding officer of the 200th base unit at Peterson Field, said the three killed were First Lt. Frederick Toomey.

His parents, who had been living in Seattle, were returning to the Flathead and had stopped to visit in Walla Walla, Wash., when they received the news of their son's death.
