Libby Flier Drowns in Lake McGregor Tuesday

Flathead county's first fatal airplane accident occurred late Tuesday afternoon when a light, three-place plane flown by Hamilton Hough of Libby lost altitude, struck a tree top and crashed into Lake McGregor. Hough was drowned while attempting to swim to shore, officers report.

According to reports of the accident, Hough and Russell Diest, formerly of this city and now operating a flying service in Libby, had flown to Missoula where they had taken a woman from Libby to a Missoula hospital. While there the men picked up a plane belonging to Diest and were returning to Libby in separate planes.

As they were flying over the McGregor lake area, Diest noticed that Hough's plane was not in sight and thinking he had decided to land at Kallispell, Diest turned around and landed at the local airport.

About 5 o'clock, a man whose name was given as Wagner, and who resides at Happy's Inn, phoned the sheriff's office and reported having seen a plane crash into McGregor lake about 400 yards from the west end.

Sheriff Duncan McCarthy and a member of the highway patrol, accompanied by Ory Armstrong and Mr. and Mrs. Russell Diest left immediately for the scene of the accident, Mr. Armstrong going on to Happy's Inn where he contacted Mr. Wagner to secure the details of the accident.

Wagner stated he noticed a plane flying very low and immediately after shearing off the top of a tree, plunge into the lake. Wagner added that after the plane hit the water, the pilot crawled out on the wing and then attempted to swim to shore but soon sank from sight.

The plane sank very shortly after hitting the water. Diest stated the plane had been tested and found satisfactory at Missoula. He has no idea what could have caused the accident.

Local officers, members of the highway patrol and members of the sheriff's force from Libby are attempting to locate the body and the plane.

Hough was reported as being about 28 years of age and married. He had been flying for about two years, it was stated. His parents who formerly resided in Libby are now living in California.

Frank Baney said Howard Wagner, who witnessed the tragedy, reported Hough swerved over the lake after trying to make a forced landing on a highway. A passing automobile caused Hough to swing the plane over the lake, Wagner said.

The plane descended into the water about 350 feet from the west shore, and Hough disappeared after swimming clear of the sinking aircraft, Wagner said. Hough was flying to Libby from Missoula.
