## Browning Man Dies Of Accident Hurts

James Johnson, of Browning, about 20 years of age, died at 5 o'clock this morning from exposure and shock following an automobile accident east of Nyack.

Johnson, with two other young men, Clinton Gilham and Wm. White, also of Browning, were traveling east on Highway No. 2 at about 1:30 this morning, when their car went off the highway at a horseshoe bend. Gilham and White were uninjured, and walked and hitch-hiked to Belton, where they reported the accident. Johnson was not badly injured, according to Coroner Campbell, who investigated. No bones were broken, but he suffered considerable shock. The other boys made him as comfortable as possible, but some time after they left he had got up and wandered around and fell into a creek. He was dead when Coroner Campbell arrived.

Johnson was in the service, and was home on furlough. His father is employed at Glacier Park station.

The body was taken to Whitefish and will be sent to Browning.
