Woman Takes Own Life Sat. Night

As the result of a gunshot wound, believed to have been self-inflicted with a .22 calibre rifle, Mrs. June Marie Lindberg, 26, passed away at the Kalispell hospital at 2 o'clock this afternoon.

Sheriff Duncan McCarthy was called to investigate the case about midnight Saturday and said, from the evidence it is believed she lay on the bed and placed the butt of the gun on the floor, firing the shot into the temple of her head.

Her husband, who operates the Appleway night club, west of Kalispell, did not hear the shot but went into the apartment in the rear of the club building where they make their home, to regulate a thermostat for the heating system, and discovered her. It is believed he entered the room about 15 minutes after the act was committed, Sheriff McCarthy said.

When discovered, Mrs. Lindberg had lost considerable blood and Mr. Lindberg called a doctor and notified the officers and he and two other men took Mrs. Lindberg to the hospital in a car.

Sheriff McCarthy stated it is thought that despondency due to ill health caused her to commit the act.

Following an investigation by Coroner Harry Campbell, it was said that no inquest will be held. The body is at the Waggener and Campbell Funeral home and services will be announced later.

William Ramey, 21, who was with Line at the time of the accident was treated for cuts and bruises at the Whitefish hospital, later being released. Line was the driver of the car, which was a light panel truck. The accident is being investigated by state highway patrolmen.

Boat Accident at Lake McGregor Ends in Tragedy

William Lockwood, 36-year-old man, drowned in a boating accident about 9:30 Sunday night in McGregor lake.

According to information received, Lockwood and three others were out riding in an outboard motor boat when the motor stalled and in an attempt to get it started, the front of the boat jerked up and the back end filled with water. Two of the party clung to the boat after it swamped while a third tried to help Lockwood who was unable to swim. Although he managed to reach him, he lost his grip and was compelled to swim ashore for his own safety.

The accident occurred about a mile east of the Boisvert camp and members of the sheriff's force are at the scene attempting to recover the body.

Lockwood was a resident of Missoula and a partner in the Palace Bar. He and his family had arrived at McGregor lake earlier in the day for a week's vacation.
