Her hueband, who operates the Appleway night club, west of Kalis-pell, did not hear the shot but went into the apartment in the rear of the club building where they make their home, to regulate a thermo-star for the heating system, and discovered her. It is believed he en-tered the room about 15 minutes after the act was committed, Sheriff McCorthy said. When discovered, Mrs. Lindberg

When discovered, Mrs. Lindberg had lost considerable blood and Mr. Lindberg called a doctor and notified the officers and he and two other men took Mrs. Lindberg to the hospital in a car.

Sheriff McCarthy stated it is thought that despondency due to ill health caused her to commit the act.
