Chas. H. McCullough Of Somers Killed By Falling Tree

Charles Henry McCullough, 80-year-old Somers resident was killed almost instantly Thursday afternoon in the woods about a mile west of Somers when struck by a falling tree.

According to Coroner Harry H. Campbell, McCullough, accompanied by Albert Lauman and a neighbor, had gone to the timber to get firewood and McCullough was shoveling a turn-around for their car when he was warned that a tree was about to fall. Looking up, McCullough evidently thought the tree was falling in his direction. It was said he then turned and ran directly into the path of the falling tree. The body was badly crushed, Coroner Campbell said.

Mr. McCullough was rushed to the KallsPELL hospital but succumbed before reaching the hospital.

The deceased came here in 1912 and had made his home with his daughter, Mrs. Elmer Rhodes at Somers.

**LOCAL SERVICEMEN
PROCLAIMED DEAD**

Word that S/Sgt. Frederick F. Metcalf, Jr., is officially dead has been received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frederick F. Metcalf of Kallispell, from Edward F. Witsell, adjutant general of the army.

The young soldier enlisted Dec. 7, 1942, when he was 18 years old. He was a Flathead High school graduate of 1942. He went overseas in January, 1944, and landed in the Marshall Islands, April 7. He was a radio operator on a B-24 bomber and was reported missing May 15, 1944, after a mission over Truk.

At the end of one year, all infor-mation was reviewed, and he was still reported as missing but the army now states the date of his death as Feb. 11, 1946.

Burning House Takes Lives Of Three Small Children

Fire, thought to have been caused by a defective stove pipe, completely destroyed the home of Mr. and Mrs. Jack Miller and caused the deaths of their three small children, Jackolee, 3, Violet Lou, 2, and Pearl, 16 months, Monday afternoon about 4 o'clock.

The house, which was completely enveloped in flames by the time the fire department arrived, was located south of Thirteenth street, between Second and Third avenues east, outside of the city limits.

Mrs. Miller stated she had left the children apparently asleep and had gone to visit a near neighbor, when the fire, which was noticed by other neighbors, occurred.

The fire had gained such headway by the time the department arrived that entrance into the small building was impossible. Mrs. Miller reported to officers that although the stove pipe was defective and had come apart at times, there was only a small fire in the heater when she left home.

Her husband, who is employed at Olney was away at the time of the tragedy and a member of the sheriff's force went to notify him of the fire and death of his children.

Mrs. Miller collapsed when told of the death of the children, and is under a doctor's care.

Coroner Harry Campbell, Fire Chief Paul Casey, and State Fire Warden J. W. Carney are making an investigation of the fire.
