Funeral services for William H. O'Connell, pioneer peace officer of Flathead county who died at Butte Thursday, were held this morning when high mass was celebrated at St. Matthew's church. The Rt. Rev. Msgr. F. X. O'Farrell was the celebrant.

Requy services were recited Sunday evening at the Johnson chapel.

pallbearers for Mr. O'Connell were old-time friends and included W. R. Martin, Harry Adams, C. A. Robinson, A. B. Yuill, Frank Baney, T. A. Thompson, Martin Sudaess and E. O. Williams. Interment was in Conrad Memorial cemetery beside his wife.

Mr. O'Connell was sheriff of Flathead county from 1906 until 1919 and also served two terms as representative in the legislature. He was a special agent for the Great Northern railroad for more than 20 years. He had been a deputy game warden in this district for some time. His wife passed away here in 1921. Mr. O'Connell is survived by three sons, Leo L. and Charles J. of Butte and John W. of Columbia Falls; one daughter, Miss Catherine O'Connell of Butte and three grandchildren.
