HIGHWAY ACCIDENT FATAL FOR LOCAL MAN SUNDAY NIGHT

Eewal Peace, 45, of Kalispell was killed late Sunday night and two companions, R. J. Griffith and Marie Foster, were injured in an automobile accident in Bad Rock Canyon about five miles east of Columbia Palls on Highway No. 2.

Coroner Harry Campbell and highway patrolnuen are investigating the accident. The Coroner indicated an inquest may be held Wednesday.

The accident happened about 11:30 Sunday night and occurred when the car, driven by Griffith, failed to negotiate a wide turn at the cast approach to the canyon and shot off the read, breaking off a tree and

then overtarning.
The occupants were all thrown from the machine and a chunk of glass pierced Peace's chest, severing a large artery and causing nearly instant death, Coroner Campbell stated. Patrolmen said the party had been at a roadhouse near Coram and were retarning to Kalispell
