HIGHWAY ACCIDENT FATAL FOR LOCAL MAN SUNDAY NIGHT

Ewall Peace, 45, of Kalspell was killed late Sunday night and two companions, R. J. Griffith and Marie Foster, were injured in an automobile accident in Bad Rock Canyon about five miles east of Columbia Falls on Highway No. 2.

Coroner Harry Campbell and highway patrolmen are investigating the accident. The Coroner indicated an inquest may be held Wednesday.

The accident happened about 11:30 Sunday night and occurred when the car, driven by Griffith, failed to negotiate a wide turn at the east approach to the canyon and shot off the road, breaking off a tree and then overturning.

The occupants were all thrown from the machine and a chunk of glass pierced Peace's chest, severing a large artery and causing nearly instant death, Coroner Campbell stated. Patrolmen said the party had been at a roadhouse near Coram and were returning to Kalspell when the accident happened.

Griffith and Miss Foster are in Kalspell general hospital being treated for head injuries, which are not considered serious.

EWALL PEACE

The body of Ewall Peace will be sent to Missoula Friday morning and services will take place there. An inquest will be held here, probably Tuesday morning to inquire further into the cause of the highway accident in which Mr. Peace lost his life.

AMM Harry Pierson Is Declared Dead

Harry Waldo Pierson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Pierson of Kalispell, has officially been declared dead by the navy, the parents have learned. He was an aviation mechanic's mate, second class, and was reported missing March 9, 1944.

The parents were informed that all the personnel from the E-24 plane were lost on a flight from Munda, on that date. No trace of the plane was found when a searching party set out. It was from the squadron VB 164 that had been at Guadalcanal.

A.M.M. Pierson enlisted December 7, 1941, after graduating from Flathead County High School. He left for training on Christmas of that year. Hope still is held for him by the parents who have learned that the navy is instigating a huge program to search for the many men who are missing.
