Young Somers Man Dies Of Injuries Received In Crash

Andrew J. Rhodes, 18, of Somers, passed away Monday afternoon at the Kallispell hospital where he was taken following a car accident which occurred late Sunday night, 21 miles south of Kallispell in the Rollins vicinity. The victim had suffered internal injuries and a broken arm.

The occupants of the car were, James Uhde, who was driving, Mary Beth Buck, and Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Rhodes. Uhde and Miss Buck were uninjured while Mrs. Rhodes, who was riding in the back seat with her husband, sustained cuts and bruises. According to the latest word from the hospital, her condition is good.

The cause of the accident is being investigated by Coroner Harry Campbell and members of the Highway patrol who state it is their belief a corrugated section of road caused the car to get out of control, plunging it over the embankment, where it overturned.

The party was going north from Rollins when the mishap occurred about 11 p. m. Sunday.

The body of Mr. Rhodes is at the Waggener and Campbell Funeral home and service arrangements will be announced later.

Mr. Rhodes had been employed at the Somers mill.
