Mrs. Stibal Succumbs To Gunshot Injuries

Frank Ross signed a confession prepared by County Attorney Measure this afternoon in which he admitted the shooting which resulted in death for Venel Stibal and his wife, Mrs. Anna Stibal, at the Soldiers' Home Wednesday morning.

Mrs. Anna Stibal died Friday morning at the Whitefish hospital, the second victim of a shooting which took place Wednesday morning at the Soldiers' home, near Columbia Falls. Little hope was held for Mrs. Stibal from the time she was admitted to the hospital. She had been shot through the abdomen.

Venel Stibal, her husband, died Wednesday evening. He had been wounded by three shots from a .32 automatic pistol.

Frank Ross, who is charged with first-degree murder in connection with the death of Mr. Stibal, was arraigned before Justice W. R. Martin, late Thursday afternoon. The defendant waived preliminary hearing and the case was bound over to district court. His bond was set at \$5,000. Flathead County Attorney Ambrose Measure expects to file information in the Eleventh Judicial District court late this afternoon or Saturday morning against Mr. Ross who is in the custody of the sheriff.

Coroner Harry Campbell has called an inquest to be held Saturday.
