**Man Run Over By  
Flat Car Friday  
Dies of Injuries**

Russell Forest White, about 30 years of age, died early this morning at Katispell General hospital following an accident in which he was run over by a flat car in the Great Northern yards here at 3 o'clock Friday afternoon.

The accident, in which the man received badly crushed legs, occurred when he reportedly laid down in the shade of the flat car to sleep and a switch engine coupled on to it and moved in.

The accident occurred on the cross-over track near the K. M. elevator.

The city ambulance was immediately called and White was taken to the hospital where it was found his right leg was severely mangled and amputation was necessary. His left leg was also crushed but amputation was decided against at the time.

Dr. F. B. Ross, who attended the man, said shock and loss of blood caused his death at 1 o'clock Saturday morning.

White, whose home address was given as Walkerville, West Virginia, had been working in a logging camp west of here. He refused to reveal information concerning himself but an uncle, Spurgan White, is reported living in Sutton, West Virginia, and authorities are attempting to contact him.

The body is at the Johnson funeral home.

**BETTY WITTLAKE  
SUCCUMBS TO  
CRASH INJURIES**

As the result of injuries received when an automobile in which she was riding crashed into the Doughboy monument on Main street late Tuesday night, Mrs. Betty Wittlake died at midnight Friday.

She suffered severe spinal injuries and had been in the hospital since the accident.

Coroner Harry H. Campbell has called an inquest for this afternoon at 4 o'clock. Floyd Derrickson, driver of the car which knocked the five-ton monument over, has been arraigned on a reckless driving charge in justice court and held in jail after failing to furnish \$1,000 bonds. Derrickson and another passenger, Mrs. Vivian Miller, received only superficial injuries in the crash.

Mrs. Wittlake has been a resident of the community for the past 17 years and was the wife of Emory Wittlake. Mrs. Wittlake was 18 years of age at the time of her death.
