

**JAMES A. WILEY**

James Albert Wiley was born to Christian and Belle Wiley on their farm in the Lower Valley, January 18, 1892.

Mr. Wiley spent the greater part of his life on this farm where he has been engaged in farming with his brother Andrew since 1923.

Mr. Wiley passed away suddenly April 6, 1946, at the age of 54 years. Mr. Willis became a member of St. Peter's Methodist church, Knobb Creek, N. C., in early life. He was also a member of the Masonic lodge and Eastern Star.
