FOLSON INDIAN YOUTH ENDS LIFE WITH RIFLE

Folson—Louis Ashley, a 15-year-old Indian boy who objected to attending school, Wednesday morning fatally shot himself in the head with a .22 caliber rifle.
Gordon Giper, acting coroner in the absence of Sheriff-Coroner Wallace J. Benudry, had the body brought from the scene, 12 miles southeast of here, to the Retz mortuary.
An inquest was to be conducted today.
The coroner said it had been learned the young man objected to school and while "playing hockey" was told he would have to go back to his classroom.
He asked for the keys to a bunkhouse and upon entering the building secured a rifle and fired the shot which ended his life.
