Injuries Fatal**

Carl Graber, 63, succumbed Tuesday night to head injuries he received that afternoon while working at the Ufford-Kinshella tie camp near Olney.

Grosswiler's Body Brought To Town Late Friday Night

The body of Ralph T. Grosswiler, who lost his life in a hunting accident on Hungry Horse mountain in the South Fork area Wednesday, was brought to Kalispell Friday night, arriving here about 11:30.

The party bringing the body of the 38-year-old Kalispell farmer out of the woods encountered considerable difficulty due to the rugged country and rough terrain in which the accident occurred.

Sheriff Walsh was notified of the tragedy Thursday afternoon and accompanied by members of his force left immediately for the scene. The party did not reach the body until 1:30 Friday morning.

While bringing the body out, the party became exhausted and Sheriff Walsh called for additional help, a second group going to the scene Friday morning.

A trail was cut to where the body lay and with the aid of forest service pack animals, the body was brought out.

Dave Higgins, who was with Grosswiler at the time of the accident and who came to town to inform the sheriff, told the officers that Grosswiler had blown the snow from the barrel of his gun and in an unknown manner the weapon was discharged. The bullet struck Grosswiler in the groin. Higgins tried unsuccessfully to check the flow of blood and while carrying him down the mountain, the victim passed away.
